THE 2022 MILITARY CHILD OF THE YEAR® AWARD (MCOY) NOMINATIONS ARE OPEN! The annual MCOY awards recognize eight outstanding young people ages 13 to 18. Seven recipients will represent a branch of the armed forces — the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Space Force, Coast Guard, and National Guard — and the eighth award, presented by Booz Allen Hamilton, is for designing an innovative solution to a local, regional, or global challenge. Eligible children must be a legal military dependent between the ages of 13-18. Nominations may be submitted by anyone - parents, siblings, teachers, coaches, clergy, neighbors, grandparents - anyone familiar with the child's achievements.

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

If you're seeking financial aid for college, the FAFSA is your number one stop! This application is used to determine students' financial need and eligibility for federal grants, loans, and work-study. Many colleges use FAFSA data to award aid from their institutions, as do some private need-based scholarship organizations. With just a few simple steps you can complete the FAFSA with ease:

- Set up your FAFSA ID (unique username and password) both students and parents should have one.
- Gather important documents (SSN, driver's license numbers, W-2s, tax returns, bank statements, etc.) – it will help save time if you have everything at your fingertips when you're ready to complete the application
- Complete the application be accurate and check for typos; errors and inconsistencies can slow down the processing time.

Important to note: FAFSA applications are FREE – do not pay to complete the form. You can access the official FAFSA form starting October 1. Get the form and more information, including online help, at www.studentaid.gov.
